Soft Hindutva: Rahul visits Gujarat temples

Cong VP's 3-day trip also includes public meetings in tribal regions

Congress vice president Rahul Gandhi on Saturday began his three-day north Gujarat tour with a visit to the Ashardham temple of the Swaminarayan sect in Banaskantha district. The visit is significant as the Swaminarayan sect has a large following among the Patel community, now belligerent to the ruling BJP over the quota issue, but its head priest had last week openly asked the believers to remain loyal to the present government in the state.

During his earlier visits to Gujarat over the last two months, Rahul has also visited temples at Dwaraka, Chokha and Santram temple in Nadiad among others. The night temples of the Congress vice president is scheduled to visit during his three-day trip include the ancient Anubhai temple in Banaskantha district, the Becharaji temple near Mehsana and Vir Mohji Wagh temple in Patan.

After a brief visit and darshan at the Ashardham temple, Rahul left for Chitroda near state capital Gandhinagar. Apart from temple visits, Rahul's three-day trip through north Gujarat would also include public meetings in tribal regions like Idar, Khedbrahma and Vadali.

The Congress vice president's itinerary is carefully planned to include the constituency of Deputy Chief Minister Nitin Patel in Mehsana as well as Vnsagar, the epicentre of Patel's agitation demanding reservations in government jobs

and higher educational institutions. Meanwhile, Defence Minister Nirupama Sitharaman said here on Saturday that Gujarat's development and progress would remain steady if the state government continues. If there is a break in the continuity then Gujarat's growth may be hampered, she hinted while addressing the media here.

She had joined the door-to-door campaign launched by the ruling BJP in Maninagar, the assembly segment of Prime Minister Narendra Modi had represented during his last tenure as Chief Minister in Gujarat.

Missing girl: HC warns of action against cops

MISSING GIRL

Taking a strict note of the Mumbai Police's failure to find a minor girl who was reported missing from the city five years ago, the Bombay High Court said that if the police department does not strategise its next move, it will not hesitate in initiating punitive action against it. A bench of justices S C Dharmadhikari and Haldar Dwyer recently dismissed the police's submission that it made all possible efforts to trace the girl and finally concluded that it was "impossible" to find her. The bench questioned why the police failed to make inquiries at "construction sites, domestic help agencies, fishing harbours, illegal distilleries, automobile garages, etc," for those were often the places where missing children who are kidnapped or lost invariably end up. "The police machinery folds its hands and says it is impossible to trace the child. They say, we have done everything that is permissible and possible out there. The report filed does not indicate that all our officers are made," the bench observed.

Google can't replace Guru: Naidu

At the meeting, a detailed

presentation by three ministers gave an overview of various programmes and initiatives of the government but brought about "Ease of Living" in the lives of the people. The meeting also saw a presentation on social media by top IAS officials, sources said. They said the presentation on "Ease of Living" last night was not about highlighting the government's achievements in the last three and a half years. The Ease of Living presentations were made by Minister of State for Agriculture, Jagdish Singh Shekhawat, Minister of State for Skill Development Anant Kumar

Hegde and Housing and Urban Development Minister Hardeep Singh Puri. This was the first such meeting after Modi reshuffled his Council of Ministers in September paving the way for new faces. Interestingly, all the three ministers, who gave the presentations, were inducted into the ministry in the last reshuffle. Besides, demineralisation and GST schemes like Muzra, Digital India, affordable housing and Ujjwala Yojana figured in the presentations claiming that these have made life easier for people. Kerala move to save kids from cyber threats

The Kerala police has come out with an initiative aimed at protecting children from cyber threats. Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan will launch the programme titled "Kid Glove" at a school here on 13 November, an official statement here said.

The programme, envisaged to educate teachers, parents and children about cyber security, is designed by the Cyberdane, the technological research and development centre of the state police here. A host of dignitaries including state police chief Lokanath Behra, IC Manoj Abraham, nodal officer of Cyberdane and Subba Kodly, chairperson, Kerala State Commission for Protection of Child Rights are expected to take part in the function, the statement said.

As part of the initiative, the Cyberdane has come up with a number of digital games with attractive titles to promote safe and healthy internet practices among children. One among the games, titled "The Stranger's friend" awareness about the fallacious activities on cyber space. It makes the decision-making capabilities of children, the statement said. The programme "Four Guardians" gives ideas about the do's and don'ts on cyber space, "Jungle Hunt" is an introduction to cyber world and digital technology. It said.

"Early Mobs" - "The Robotic Academy", "Zombu's Palace", "Membership Game" and "Cunning Fox" are other digital games part of the Kid Glove programme. An awareness class for parents and teachers about their security also forms part of the initiative, it added.

'Govt owns Biswa Bangla'

Aslay after the newly inducted BJP leader and former Union Minister P. Venkatesh Reddy, the newly inducted Congress MP Atul Kojariwal has levelled serious charges against Chief Minister Manohar Banerjee and his nephew Abhishek Banerjee over the ownership of the Biswa Bangla brand, top state officials for the second consecutive day insisted. The state government owned the brand. "If anyone claims that it (Biswa Bangla) is a private company, it is wrong. It is a government company," Rajiva Sinha, secretary of the state MSMI and the department told the news agency. Mr Sinha, in the presence

of state home secretary Atri Bhattacharya, said the Chief Minister had created the Biswa Bangla logo and "buried it away" to the state government. "She is the creator and we are the users of the logo. Any department of the state government can use it," he said. Mr Sinha further clarified: "In 2014 Miss Banerjee went into an agreement with us and transferred the logo to us in a manner that she is the creator and we are the users of the logo. When we went for registration, we were told by the Trademark Registry that six months back two applications had been submitted. Later, Mr Abhishek Banerjee told the news agency in a written form in which we accepted by

the Registry of Trade Mark." Purported documents distributed by Mr Roy yesterday revealed that the application was on 29 November 2013 by CI Associates in the name of Abhishek Banerjee residing at 30H Harish Chatterjee Street, Kalghat. The state officials today said that the application was withdrawn on 11 June 2014. Following which, the state government applied for the logo in 2014 and got the registration on 31 December 2014. Mr Roy said during the day he was newly accepted the legal challenge the trademark had threatened to throw at him. "I am prepared to present my case in the court of law and win the whole truth will come out," he said.

Governance at virtual standstill in Himachal

Along a painful wait by both people and politicians has begun, after the culmination of a hectic poll process on 9 November. The fate of 317 candidates sealed in the VVT machines will be known only on 18 December along with the people's own fate - will either the ruling Congress will retain power, or BJP will form the new government. The model code of conduct will remain in force till the new government of Himachal Pradesh will stay somewhat paralysed. No new appointments and major decisions will be allowed to be taken unless specifically permitted by the Election Commission. Many intelligent citizens in the state are against this long wait and the problems arising from partial non-governance in different parts. "How can the poll results of a small, remote hill state like Himachal affect the poll outcome of the distant Gujarat? The concerns and issues are totally different. Even if elections were to be held in a neighbouring state, there may be some unsubstantiated argument in it, but in this case, breaking the process into two stages on the same day and continuing the code of conduct for such



a long time in Himachal does not seem to be fair." Bysachi yadavki (it is argued), in this age of electronic media, all states should be under the Model Code of Conduct. In by-elections, too, it can be argued, a whole state or the other concerned states can be put under the Code. Such views are backed by academicians and leaders in the state merit serious thinking by the county's legislative bodies. This can save the Supreme Court's valuable time, because this and other rules governing elections are bound to be challenged soon. Incidentally, an NGO (Social Welfare

Council of India) has demanded several modifications in the rules and procedures governing elections in a public statement issued here. It also demanded that the period of election campaigning should be 60 days for all state assemblies and results should be declared within three days of polls. Meanwhile, in all the market places and crowded areas like the Mall in major towns of the state people are being treated to heated political speculation, astrological predictions, remedial religious rituals, etc. Mass rallies in the conditions of power are being throwing up excuses in the name of the code of conduct for not taking even ordinary decisions of governance. The mindboggling number of Congress and BJP leaders that their own party will win with a

slumping majority" are being received with a pinch of salt and amusement. BJP leaders claim that record polling of votes (about 75% for the 66 assembly seats in Himachal) indicate "people's mood for a change in government." Chief Minister Virbhadra Singh has predicted a convincing victory for the Congress.

The Congress victory functions in government and other sectors (only special and key government agencies and departments to take place). The lucky number of BJP's winning is said to be 52, whereas Dharmal's is predicted to be 9. When the results are out on 18 December, the Congress will be the number one party in the state. Even the number plates of vehicles will change overnight. They had in each case should be the same number. Many BJP supporters are getting ready with both the numbers. But a veteran observer of politics over the last four decades says, "The fact is, everything is in the stage - everything is only game work. As always, the common voter is silent or just evasive." But BJP workers' mood is very upbeat, while Congress workers seem to be cautious. Overall, it's like in a slow-motion movie.
